**ONE & SIX YEAR
STREET IMPROVEMENT PLAN
2025-2030
VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA**

In 1970, the State of Nebraska initiated a program developed to provide an integrated system of public roads for the state, counties, and municipalities. The Department of Transportation and each county and municipality develops a long range Six-Year Plan of highway, road, and street improvements. The Six-Year Plan is required by law to be extended annually and kept on file with the Village Clerk.

Along with the Six-Year Plan, a One-Year Plan shall be annually prepared and placed on file with the Village Clerk for specific highway, road, and street improvements for the current year.

These plans must first be approved and adopted by the Governing Body after a public hearing.

In the previous 2024 program year, the Village of Eagle completed the following projects:


- M-259(35), 6th Street from D Street to F Street and D Street from 5th Street to 6th Street, project cost total \$46,651.
- M-259(36), 2nd Street from D Street to F Street, project cost total \$39,346.
- Miscellaneous Maintenance Projects totaling \$24,244.

Total Project Improvements completed in the year 2024 was \$110,241.

The 2025-2030 One- and Six-Year Street Improvement Plan includes the following and is described in more detail on the following pages.

- The One-Year Street Improvement Plan for 2025 consists of general maintenance and one project consisting of 2,100 ft of street improvements. This project totals approximately 2,100' of pavement reconstruction and is estimated to cost \$128,000.
- The remaining five projects on the Six-Year Improvements Plan for 2025-2030 consist of 8 blocks of street improvements. These projects total approximately 2,000' of sidewalk, curb work, grading, and storm sewer and 650' of mill and overlay activities and are estimated to cost \$1,268,000.
 - o The estimated cost of all projects is \$1,396,000.
- A location map for each plan and a summary of the individual projects and their estimated costs are included in this report.

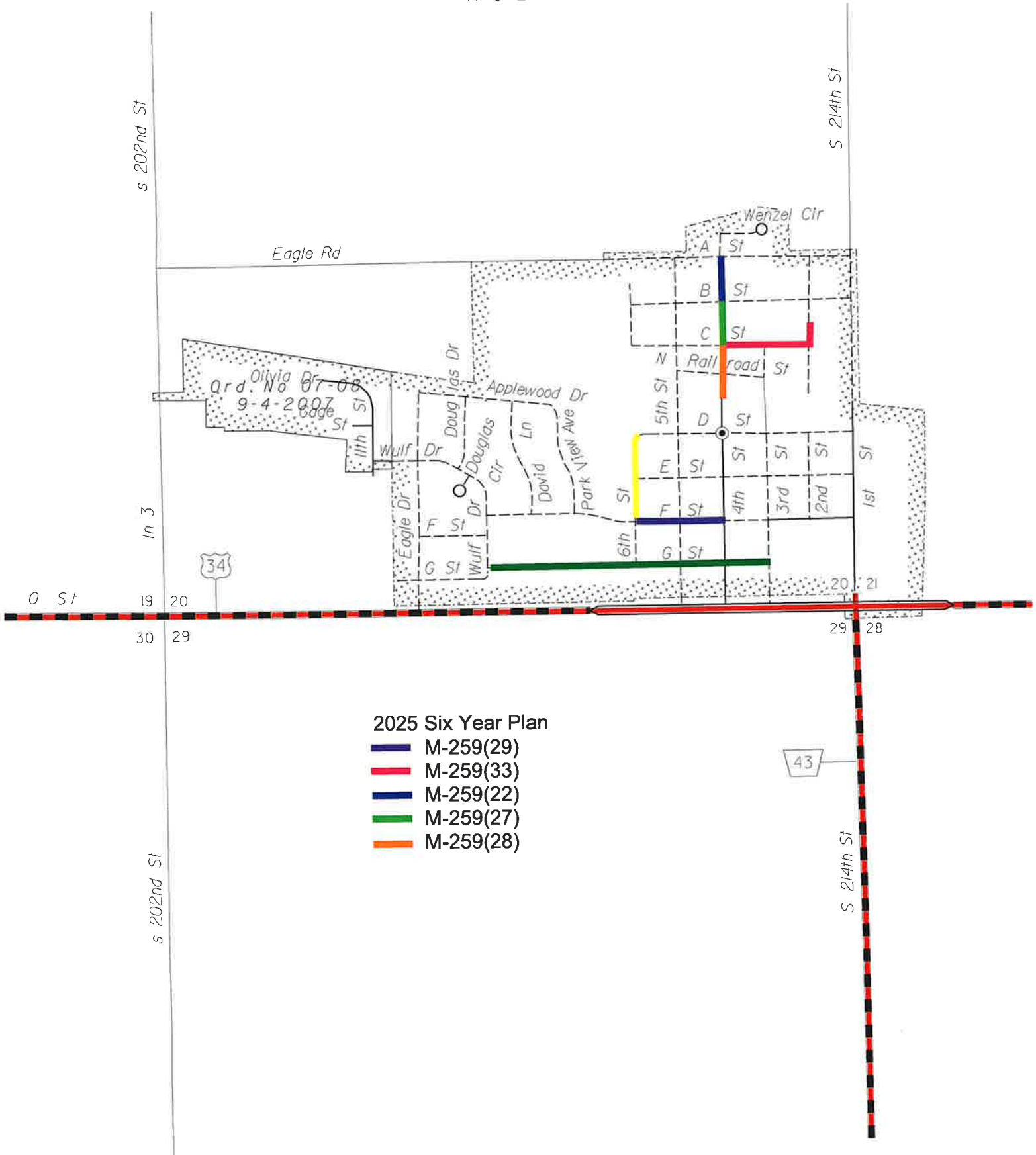

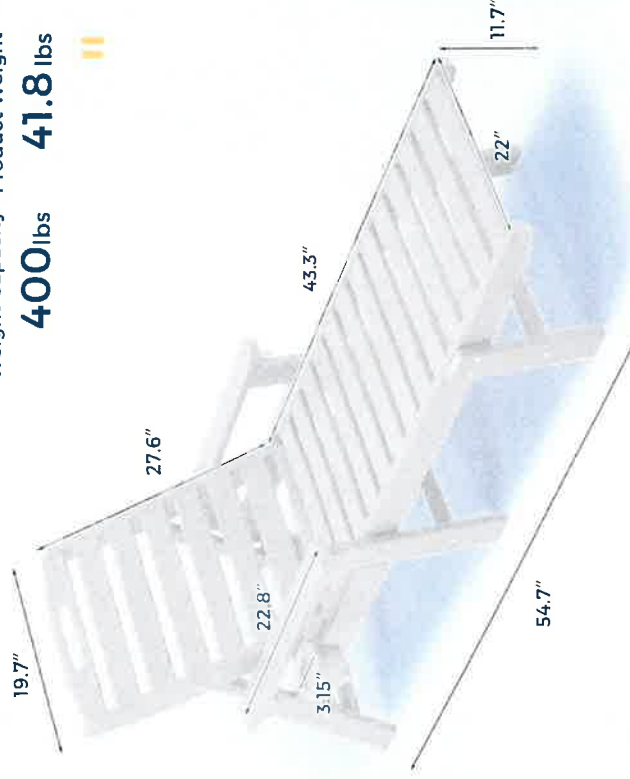
