# ONE & SIX YEAR STREET IMPROVEMENT PLAN 2023-2028 VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA

In 1970, the State of Nebraska initiated a program developed to provide an integrated system of public roads for the state, counties, and municipalities. The Department of Transportation and each county and municipality develops a long range Six-Year Plan of highway, road, and street improvements. The Six-Year Plan is required by law to be extended annually and kept on file with the Village Clerk.

Along with the Six-Year Plan, a One-Year Plan shall be annually prepared and placed on filed with the Village Clerk for specific highway, road, and street improvements for the current year.

These plans must first be approved and adopted by the Governing Body after a public hearing.

In the current 2022 program year, the Village of Eagle completed the following projects:

- M-259(31), Wenzel Circle from 4<sup>th</sup> Street Mill & Overlay Improvements, project cost total \$97,324.18.
- Miscellaneous Maintenance Projects totaling \$19,126.50.

Total Project Improvements completed in the year 2022 was \$116,450.68.

The 2023-2028 One- and Six-Year Street Improvement Plan includes the following and is described in more detail on the following pages.

- The One-Year Street Improvement Plan for 2023 consists of general maintenance and two projects consisting of nearly 6 blocks of street improvements. These projects total over 1,900' of pavement reconstruction and are estimated to cost \$125,000.
- The remaining four project on the Six-Year Improvements Plan for 2023-2028 consist of 9 blocks of street improvements. These projects total approximately 1,700 of pavement reconstruction and 1,300' of mill and overlay activities and are estimated to cost \$1,318,000.
  - The estimated cost of all projects is \$1,443,000.
- A location map for each plan and a summary of the individual projects and their estimated costs are included in this report.





#### ORDINANCE NO. 2023-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, TO AMEND CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 1, SECTION 3-108 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, PERTAINING TO WATER RATES BY AMENDING SAID RATES; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR SAID RATES; TO PROVIDE THAT THE CHAIR AND THE APPROPRIATE DEPARTMENT, WHETHER ONE OR MORE, OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO IMPLEMENT THIS ORDINANCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF ANY SECTION, CLAUSE, PROVISION OR PORTION FOUND UNCONSTITUTIONAL OR INVALID; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PUBLISHED WITHIN THE FIRST 15 DAYS AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL EITHER IN PAMPHLET FORM OR BY POSTING IN THREE PUBLIC PLACES IN THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AND SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL, AND PUBLICATION, AS PROVIDED HEREIN; AND TO PROVIDE THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME AND BE MADE A PART OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AND THE SECTIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE MAY BE RENUMBERED TO ACCOMPLISH SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, Section 3-108 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, specifies the water rates to be charged to users of the Eagle water system, and,

WHEREAS, no amendment to the standard fees and variable usage fees have been made since May 15, 2015.

WHEREAS, the cost of providing water service to the users of the Municipal system has changed and an amendment to the same is in order, and,

WHEREAS, the Chairperson and Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, do desire to amend the rates to account for and pay for the operation and maintenance expense incurred by the Village to offer said service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRPERSON AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, as follows:

- Section 1. That the findings here and above should be, and they are hereby made a part of this Ordinance, as fully as if set out at length herein.
- Section 2. That Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 108 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, shall be amended to read as follows:

### §3-108 MUNICIPAL WATER DEPARTMENT; USE RATES.

- A. All water consumers located within the corporate limits of the Municipality of Eagle, Nebraska, shall be liable for the following user rates as set by ordinance for all water which is reported to have flowed through the water meter of the consumer. The following rates will be charged for water service:
  - (1) The sum of eight dollars (\$8.00) nine dollars (\$9.00) shall be charged for all water consumed up to and including one thousand (1,000) gallons per month. This eight dollars (\$8.00) nine dollars (\$9.00) per month charge shall be a minimum charge for water service and shall be assessed against all Eagle water users within the corporate limit.
    - In addition to the minimum charge established herein, the following rates for water service shall apply:
  - (2) The sum of one dollar and forty cents (\$1.40) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of one thousand (1,000) gallons per month, up to and including four thousand (4,000) gallons per month.
  - (3) The sum of one dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of four thousand (4,000) gallons per month, up to and including nine thousand (9,000) gallons per month.
  - (4) The sum of two dollars and ten cents (\$2.10) four dollars and twenty cents (\$4.20) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of nine thousand (9,000) gallons per month, up to and including fourteen thousand (14,000) gallons per month.
  - (5) The sum of two dollars and forty-five cents (\$2.45) four dollars and ninety cents (\$4.90) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of fourteen thousand (14,000) gallons per month, up to and including nineteen thousand (19,000) gallons per month.
  - (6) The sum of two dollars and eighty cents (\$2.80) five dollars and sixty cents (\$5.60) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of nineteen thousand (19,000) gallons per month.
  - (7) Water may be furnished by the Municipality of Eagle for construction purposes in strict accordance with this paragraph. The contractor shall contact the Municipal maintenance staff and obtain a water meter prior to obtaining the Municipality's water. The water so obtained shall be metered using the meter provided by the Municipal maintenance department and shall be obtained from a site designated by the Municipal maintenance department and equipped with a backflow prevention device. The minimum charge for the water so obtained shall be \$25 fifty dollars (\$50.00) per load and, in addition, the sum of \$10 twenty dollars (\$20.00) shall be charged for each 1,000 gallons of water obtained in excess of 2,000 gallons. Upon completion of the loading of the water, the

contractor shall return the meter to the Municipal Clerk and pay the charges incurred for the water obtained. The contractor shall be responsible for any damage done to the water furnished by the Municipality.

- B. All non-resident users, approved for access by the Municipality, shall pay 175% of the rates set forth above in subparagraphs 1 through 6, for premises not located within the corporate boundaries of the Municipality. Non-resident users shall be subject to all ordinances, resolutions, rules, and regulations adopted by the Municipality, regarding use and operation of the water system of the Municipality, including but not limited to, the operation and maintenance of water meter and system protection devices, water use restrictions, termination of service, and payment of water use fees.
  - C. These rates shall be effective commencing on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2023. (Ref. 17-538 RS Neb.)
  - Section 4. That the Chair and the appropriate Department, whether one or more, of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, are hereby authorized and directed to implement this Ordinance.
  - Section 5. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage, approval, and publication of this Ordinance, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
  - Section 6. That should any section, paragraph, sentence of this Ordinance hereby adopted be declared for any reason to be invalid, it is the intent of the Chair and Governing Body of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, that it would have passed all other portions of this Ordinance independent of the elimination here from of any such portion as may be declared invalid.
  - Section 7. That this Ordinance shall be published within the first 15 days after its passage and approval either in pamphlet form or by posting in three public places in the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and shall be in full force and take effect on the 15<sup>th</sup> day from and after its passage, approval, and publication, as provided herein.
  - Section 8. That it is the intention of the Chair and Governing Body of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall amend the Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

**Section 1.** COMPENSATION SCHEDULE FOR EAGLE POOL EMPLOYEES AS FOLLOWS:

\$11.00

Lifeguards/Pool Operator:

\$10.50

Office Assistant:

\$7.00

The wage for any returning Lifeguard or Pool Operator will increase by \$0.25 per hour each season.

**Section 2.** The above schedule of compensation shall run for the duration of the 2023 pool season, unless amended by ordinance of the Village of Eagle.

**Section 3.** That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage, approval, and publication of this Ordinance, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.

- 3 That the effective date of this rate shall be May 1, 2023 and shall expire on April 30, 2024.

The property owner feels the Village should consider sharing responsibility for this portion of the project since similar work was approved adjacent to this location. Caylor cautioned that sharing costs on a project may set a precedent for future requests. Hochstein said this particular situation appears to be more of a cosmetic upgrade rather than a possible safety issue. Caddy said there would be a drop off in this ditch but nothing more severe than what already exists around town. Surman asked if this is money that would just be thrown away once 4<sup>th</sup> Street is replaced with curb and gutter. Meier said yes. The Village Board generally agreed to take no action on the cost-share request.

Chairperson Todd read Ordinance 2023-03 entitled:

ORDINANCE NO. 2023-03

AN ORDINANCE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, TO AMEND CHAPTER 3, ARTICLE 1, SECTION 3-108 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, PERTAINING TO WATER RATES BY AMENDING SAID RATES; TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR SAID RATES; TO PROVIDE THAT THE CHAIR AND THE APPROPRIATE DEPARTMENT, WHETHER ONE OR MORE, OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED AND DIRECTED TO IMPLEMENT THIS ORDINANCE; TO PROVIDE FOR THE SEVERABILITY OF ANY SECTION, CLAUSE, PROVISION OR PORTION FOUND UNCONSTITUTIONAL OR INVALID; TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; TO PROVIDE THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE PUBLISHED WITHIN THE FIRST 15 DAYS AFTER ITS PASSAGE AND APPROVAL EITHER IN PAMPHLET FORM OR BY POSTING IN THREE PUBLIC PLACES IN THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AND SHALL BE IN FULL FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT FROM AND AFTER ITS PASSAGE, APPROVAL, AND PUBLICATION, AS PROVIDED HEREIN; AND TO PROVIDE THAT THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BECOME AND BE MADE A PART OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE VILAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, AND THE SECTIONS OF THIS ORDINANCE MAY BE RENUMBERED TO ACCOMPLISH SUCH INTENTION.

WHEREAS, Section 3-108 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, specifies the water rates to be charged to users of the Eagle water system, and,

WHEREAS, no amendment to the standard fees and variable usage fees have been made since May 15, 2015.

WHEREAS, the cost of providing water service to the users of the Municipal system has changed and an amendment to the same is in order, and,

WHEREAS, the Chairperson and Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, do desire to amend the rates to account for and pay for the operation and maintenance expense incurred by the Village to offer said service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CHAIRPERSON AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF EAGLE, NEBRASKA, as follows:

Section 1. That the findings here and above should be, and they are hereby made a part of this Ordinance, as fully as if set out at length herein.

Section 2. That Chapter 3, Article 1, Section 108 of the Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, shall be amended to read as follows:

§3-108 MUNICIPAL WATER DEPARTMENT; USE RATES.

- A. All water consumers located within the corporate limits of the Municipality of Eagle, Nebraska, shall be liable for the following user rates as set by ordinance for all water which is reported to have flowed through the water meter of the consumer. The following rates will be charged for water service:
  - (1) The sum of eight dollars (\$8.00) nine dollars (\$9.00) shall be charged for all water consumed up to and including one thousand (1,000) gallons per month. This eight dollars (\$8.00) nine dollars (\$9.00) per month charge shall be a minimum charge for water service and shall be assessed against all Eagle water users within the corporate limit.
    - In addition to the minimum charge established herein, the following rates for water service shall apply:
  - (2) The sum of one dollar and forty cents (\$1.40) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of one thousand (1,000) gallons per month, up to and including four thousand (4,000) gallons per month.
  - (3) The sum of one dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of four thousand (4,000) gallons per month, up to and including nine thousand (9,000) gallons per month.
  - (4) The sum of two dollars and ten cents (\$2.10) four dollars and twenty cents (\$4.20) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of nine thousand (9,000) gallons per month, up to and including fourteen thousand (14,000) gallons per month.
  - (5) The sum of two dollars and forty-five cents (\$2.45) four dollars and ninety cents (\$4.90) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of fourteen thousand (14,000) gallons per month, up to and including nineteen thousand (19,000) gallons per month.
  - (6) The sum of two dollars and eighty cents (\$2.80) five dollars and sixty cents (\$5.60) shall be charged for each one thousand (1,000) gallons consumed in excess of nineteen thousand (19,000) gallons per month.
  - (7) Water may be furnished by the Municipality of Eagle for construction purposes in strict accordance with this paragraph. The contractor shall contact the Municipal maintenance staff and obtain a water meter prior to obtaining the Municipality's water. The water so obtained shall be metered using the meter provided by the Municipal maintenance department and shall be obtained from a site designated by the Municipal maintenance department and equipped with a backflow prevention device. The minimum charge for the water so obtained shall be \$25 fifty dollars (\$50.00) per load and, in addition, the sum of \$10 twenty dollars (\$20.00) shall be charged for each 1,000 gallons of water

obtained in excess of 2,000 gallons. Upon completion of the loading of the water, the contractor shall return the meter to the Municipal Clerk and pay the charges incurred for the water obtained. The contractor shall be responsible for any damage done to the water furnished by the Municipality.

- B. All non-resident users, approved for access by the Municipality, shall pay 175% of the rates set forth above in subparagraphs 1 through 6, for premises not located within the corporate boundaries of the Municipality. Non-resident users shall be subject to all ordinances, resolutions, rules, and regulations adopted by the Municipality, regarding use and operation of the water system of the Municipality, including but not limited to, the operation and maintenance of water meter and system protection devices, water use restrictions, termination of service, and payment of water use fees.
  - C. These rates shall be effective commencing on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May, 2023. (*Ref.* 17-538 RS Neb.)
  - Section 4. That the Chair and the appropriate Department, whether one or more, of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, are hereby authorized and directed to implement this Ordinance.
  - Section 5. That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage, approval, and publication of this Ordinance, in conflict herewith, are hereby repealed.
  - Section 6. That should any section, paragraph, sentence of this Ordinance hereby adopted be declared for any reason to be invalid, it is the intent of the Chair and Governing Body of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, that it would have passed all other portions of this Ordinance independent of the elimination here from of any such portion as may be declared invalid.
  - Section 7. That this Ordinance shall be published within the first 15 days after its passage and approval either in pamphlet form or by posting in three public places in the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and shall be in full force and take effect on the 15<sup>th</sup> day from and after its passage, approval, and publication, as provided herein.
  - Section 8. That it is the intention of the Chair and Governing Body of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and it is hereby ordained that the provisions of this Ordinance shall amend the Municipal Code of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, and the sections of this Ordinance may be renumbered to accomplish such intention.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Todd, to accept the second reading of Ordinance 2023-03. Voting: Ayes - 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to approve the 2023 Village of Eagle brush chipping rules. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Report on Streets and Maintenance – Caddy said the plan is to begin street sweeping in mid-April. A pothole exists at the intersection of 202<sup>nd</sup> & Olivia Drive that is on the Cass County portion of roadway. Caddy said the 2013 Chevy Silverado is having a diesel exhaust fluid (DEF) issue and will be going to Copple Chevrolet tomorrow for repairs. Belt and Graham are in the process of painting the interior walls and adding epoxy flooring to the park restrooms; the anticipated opening date for the facilities is April 1, 2023. Caddy said pipe was picked up for the two culvert projects on the east side of town. The staff will be meeting with Nebraska Generator this week to discuss installation of the new generator for the Hartland Estates lift station. Todd said water pools at the intersection of Highway 34 & Eagle Drive due to inadequate drainage and asked who is responsible for repairs. Nystrom said this is the responsibility of the State of Nebraska Department of Transportation; he will contact them to make them aware of the situation. Caddy said the new swimming pool diving board was received. Meier requested bids for new urinals at the pool restrooms.

Report on Wells and Sewer – Caddy said the sludge tank is full at the WWTP so arrangements have been made to haul solids away this week. The Hartland Estates lift station was pumped out by Southwick Liquid Waste due to an accumulation of grease and other by-products.

Motion by Meier, second by Hochstein, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Todd, second by Dobbins, to approve the donation of two 2023 Family Pool Passes to Eagle PTE for Eagle Fun Night on March 24, 2023. Voting: Ayes -5. Motion carried.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to approve hiring KiLee Newell as the Eagle Pool Manager for the 2023 season. Voting: Ayes – 5. Motion carried.

Motion by Todd, second by Hochstein, to approve the Park Board hiring the remaining swimming pool employees for the 2023 season. Voting: Ayes - 5. Motion carried.

Report from Committees and Boards – The Eagle Park & Recreation Commission met on March 8, 2023. Todd said one item that was discussed was the Frisbee Golf course design; tee pads will need to be purchased ahead of installation work. Caddy asked if it has been decided where some of the old playground equipment will be reinstalled. Nystrom said a couple of Park & Rec members will meet with the maintenance department to decide on installation locations. Surman asked if the swimming pool operating hours have been determined for the season. Nystrom said no; however, some discussion has been held about scaling back the opening time to 1:00 PM due to the limited number of patrons between 11:00 AM-1:00 PM.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:02 p.m.
