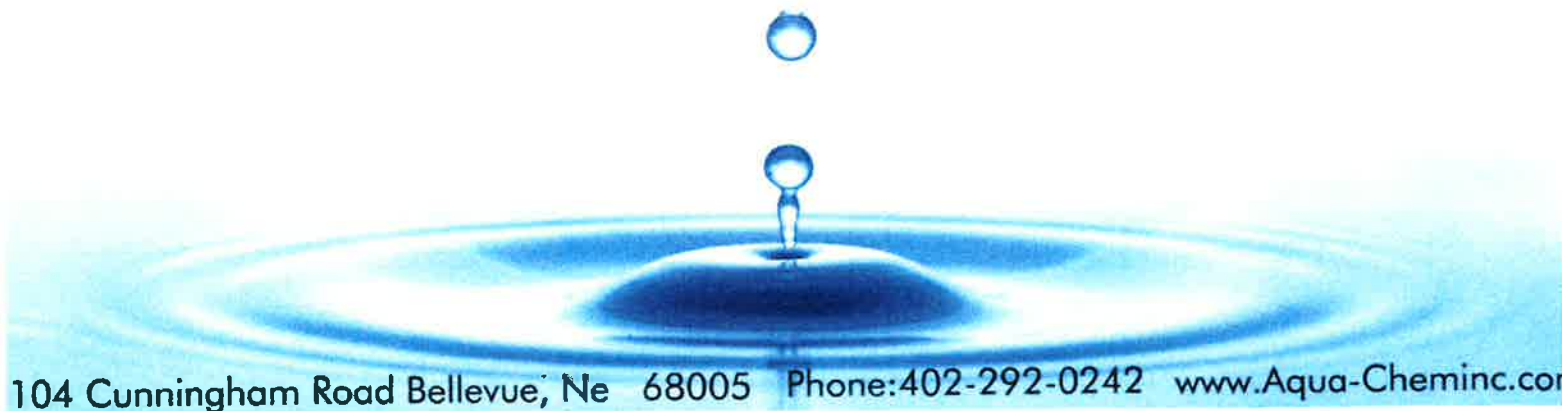

The Village Board of Trustees met in regular session at 7:00 p.m. on June 2, 2026 with Hochstein, Meier and Surman present. Todd and Dobbins were absent. The Agenda items listed thereon were sufficiently descriptive to give the public reasonable notice of the matters to be considered at the meeting. The Chairperson, at the beginning of the meeting, informed the public about the location of the posted current copy of the Open Meetings Act. Chairperson Hochstein named the three (3) areas where the agenda was posted as follows: Eagle Municipal Building, Eagle Fire & Rescue Department and Eagle Municipal Park. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve the purchase of a Lifepak 35 Docking Station from Stryker in the amount of \$1,664.00. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Public Comment – No public comment.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request to host two pool parties during the 2026 season. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve a Special Event Permit and closure of Applewood Drive between David Lane and Douglas Drive on July 4, 2026 from 12:00 p.m. to 11:59 p.m. Voting: Ayes – 4. Motion carried.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve the estimate from Reny's Gravel Grading for grading the north driveway and parking lot at Eagle Municipal Park in the amount of \$700.00. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to introduce Resolution 2026-10. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Village Clerk Nystrom read Resolution 2026-10 entitled:

RESOLUTION NO. 2026-10

WHEREAS, the Governing Body of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, has enacted a Municipal Code, and,

WHEREAS, Municipal Code §5-210 provides that the Board of Trustees may provide for the placing of stop signs, or other signs, signals, standards, or mechanical devices in any street or alley under the Municipality's jurisdiction for the purpose of regulating, or prohibiting traffic thereon, by resolution, and,

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, as the Village of Eagle's Governing Body, does desire to adopt this resolution providing for

an official school zone which is located within the corporate limits of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, to wit:

- I. A "School Ahead" sign located on the east side of 1st Street, approximately two hundred twenty-eight feet (228') north of Highway 34; and,
- II. A "School Crossing" sign located on the east side of 1st Street, approximately eighteen feet (18') south of E Street; and,
- III. An "End School Zone" sign located on the east side of 1st Street, approximately seventy-one feet (71') north of D Street; and,
- IV. A "School Ahead" sign located on the west side of 1st Street, approximately seventy-one feet (71') south of D Street; and,
- V. A "School Crossing" sign located on the west side of 1st Street, approximately forty-five feet (45') north of E Street; and,
- VI. An "End School Zone" sign located on the west side of 1st Street, approximately two hundred twenty-eight feet (228') north of Highway 34.

Motion by Meier, second by Surman, to adopt Resolution 2026-10. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Motion by Meier, second by Surman, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

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Report from Fire & Rescue – Makinsey Lonergan (Rescue Captain) reported 11 rescue calls, 3 fire calls and 2 hazardous material calls since the May 18, 2026 board meeting. A mass casualty vehicle collision training has been scheduled with Elmwood Fire & Rescue. Training with the Eagle Pool lifeguards will be held next month.

Motion by Hochstein, second by Meier, to approve the purchase of a Lifepak 35 Docking Station from Stryker in the amount of \$1,664.00. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Discuss/possible action: Updates on the new Fire & Rescue Facility – Luke Renken (Fire Captain) said the concrete slabs have been poured and sanitary sewer work should be completed this week.

Public Comment – No public comment.

Motion by Surman, second by Meier, to approve Eagle Park & Recreation's request to host two pool parties during the 2026 season. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

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WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, as the Village of Eagle's Governing Body, does desire to adopt this resolution providing for an official school zone which is located within the corporate limits of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, to wit:

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- V. A "School Crossing" sign located on the west side of 1st Street, approximately forty-five feet (45') north of E Street; and,
- VI. An "End School Zone" sign located on the west side of 1st Street, approximately two hundred twenty-eight feet (228') north of Highway 34.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Eagle, Nebraska, as follows:

Section 1. That the findings hereinabove made should be and are hereby made a part of this Resolution as fully as if set out at length herein.

Section 2. That traffic control devices, to wit: "School Ahead", "School Crossing", and "End School Zone" signs, be erected on the East and West sides of 1st Street, so that the official school zone described above is adequately marked.

Section 3. That upon the approval of this Resolution, the aforementioned traffic control devices shall be erected and this Resolution shall remain in full force and effect until further action by the Governing Body.

Motion by Meier, second by Surman, to adopt Resolution 2026-10. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Report on Streets and Maintenance – Surman said the "No Parking" sign adjacent to Eagle Family Dentistry along 4th Street was installed. Brush chipping will resume

tomorrow after an employee was injured this morning. The metal shed at 6th & G Street was torn down per the direction of the Board. Meier encouraged public works to make plans to remove concrete from the sand and gravel lot and to install the new box on the Freightliner.

Report on Wells and Sewer – Nystrom said water usage continues to be lower than last year due to more rainfall. Well draw down tests have been good.

Motion by Meier, second by Surman, to approve minutes as typed for the previous meeting. Voting: Ayes – 3. Motion carried.

Report from Committees and Boards – Surman reminded the Board that budget season is upcoming. Nystrom said he finally received a bid from Eagle Nursery on replacing four Taylor juniper trees adjacent to the office; due to this bid being much lower than what was originally approved, his recommendation is to approve this proposal instead. The Board agreed. Terry Caddy said the office plans to have general discussions with the Village Engineer regarding future WWTP expansion and options for new water wells. Meier said he would like to see the Technology Committee give access to the monument sign displays to the office staff. He would also like step-by-step instructions created to operate the YouTube channel and camera system for meetings.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:23 p.m.
